Open & Affirming Proposal Presented at the First Christian Church Board Meeting on April 28, 2024

Dear Members of the First Christian Church Board,

As our church continues to navigate our journey of faith for wholeness in a fragmented world, the ad hoc team for Inclusive Spirit is proposing an important step forward for our congregation. It is with great enthusiasm and commitment that we present to you the proposal for First Christian Church Wilson, NC to officially become an Open and Affirming congregation.

Did you already think we were Open and Affirming? So did a few of us!

For many years, our church has embraced the principles of inclusivity, acceptance, and love for all. We have strived to create a welcoming and supportive environment where everyone feels valued and respected. However, despite our longstanding practice of inclusivity, we have yet to formalize our commitment through an official Open and Affirming declaration.

By becoming an Open and Affirming congregation, we have the opportunity to reaffirm our dedication to the values of love, compassion, and justice that lie at the heart of our Christian faith. This declaration would serve as a public statement of our commitment to embracing and celebrating the diversity of God's creation, ensuring that all individuals, regardless of their race, gender, age, sexual orientation, gender expression, nationality, ethnicity, marital status, physical or mental ability, political stance or theological perspective feel safe, valued, and fully included in the life and leadership of our church community.

Our Inclusive Spirit ad hoc team includes Theresa Mathis, Tish Scott, Robby Boyette, Stephanie Pridgen, Roy Henderson, Alysun Skinner, and Rev. Scott Schieber.

Formally adopting an Open and Affirming stance would not only align with our core values but also reflect the evolving social and cultural landscape in which we live. It will also grant us the opportunity to extend our outreach efforts and engage authentically with marginalized communities both within and beyond our church walls. We believe it is imperative that our church stands as a beacon of light, love, and affirmation, welcoming all, as God has welcomed us.

In practical terms, adopting an Open and Affirming designation would involve a process of education, dialogue, and discernment within our congregation. It would require us to engage in meaningful conversations about the theological, ethical, and practical dimensions of inclusion, as well as to address any concerns (continued on Page 6)

Minister's Corner

Affirmed

As you have probably heard and can read about in this edition of The Church Bell, FCC is now in the process of discernment toward becoming officially an Open and Affirming (O&A) congregation in the Christian Church-DOC. It is widely-held that we are already living this designation, and I agree. So why change? Here's some perspective from beyond the walls of FCC.

Our denomination itself is officially Open and Affirming, in that all people are welcome into all forms of church life, including ordained ministry. The denomination allows individual congregations



to decide for themselves if they would like to work toward the designation. By my estimate, about 40% of Disciples congregations are already O&A. The church I recently served in Columbus has been O&A since 2020. One thing I learned from the pastor who served there at the time is the importance of being able to take a stand while maintaining the role of pastor to the entire congregation. I am committed to, and anticipate, having conversations with those of you who have reservations about this movement. My role in that time is to hear your thoughts, and dialogue with you, and not have a debate.

From a day-to-day perspective, I don't believe becoming O&A will change much at FCC. My preaching won't change and our celebrations of inclusion will not change. I believe that change will come in how we are seen by people outside of our church. Our website and social media will reflect that we do welcome everyone. We will be designated as O&A on our website and the Disciples' website, which will attract people to our church, members of the LGBTQ community and allies alike.

When I began to search for a congregation to serve last year, I was clear that I would only consider churches that are O&A. It was suggested to me that FCC is on its way, and I'd have the opportunity to help the process. I have been an ally for decades. Many of you know that my daughter is in a same-sex relationship; that is a new thing for Beth and I, but Cate's announcement hasn't changed our outlook on the matter, it has only deepened it. I don't see this movement within our congregation as personal toward anyone in favor or opposed to the movement. We are simply making official what we already are. We aren't moving in this direction to placate anyone or to alienate anyone; we have moved to take this step because we believe that it's the right thing to do.

As our church explores the process of becoming officially Open and Affirming of all people, you may have questions or wish to join in the conversation.

Plan to join us on Sunday, May 19 at 4:30pm in Fellowship Hall for an ice cream social. At that time, a few people will tell some stories of their own experience, then we will host a listening session where the members of FCC can ask questions or provide their own feedback. If you can't make it, a similar session will be held on July 17 at 7 pm.

Additionally, Wilson Pride is being held on June 1 and 2 this year. FCC will again have an active presence in celebrating inclusion in Wilson. If you are interested in being involved, you're invited to a planning meeting on Thursday, May 16 at 6pm in the Parlor. You don't have to attend the meeting to participate, but good planning will help us to put our best foot forward in the celebration!

Dear Church Family,

On Sunday, April 28, I stood with the Inclusive Spirit Team and proposed that FCC become an official Open and Affirming Church. For some, this proposal was a surprise as many FCC members thought our congregation was already! Well... we are - kinda. FCC has been living as a loving, supporting, and affirming congregation for at least 15 years. The day you accepted my family into FCC you became open & affirming. And you've continued to do so as you have accepted my service with Vacation Bible School, Stephen Ministry, Nurture and Growth (Education), Sunday School, Deacon, Elder, Board Chair and Vice Chair and the Easter Bunny liaison. And you've expanded that acceptance to other families.

I would imagine a handful of questions are already popping up in the parking lot conversations. We will be holding a series of summer gatherings to answer those questions and also have some fun together. I hope you will attend. (see flyer)

The first question we think members may be asking is — why do we need to be official, isn't the way we've been doing it good enough? For a while it was okay, but times have changed. There are so many churches out there that declare they are "welcoming". However, once inside visitors discover that the term is just a courtesy word. The old fashion "bait & switch" process begins. Newcomers that thought they were walking into a loving congregation suddenly become topics of conversation, targets of derogatory messages and made to feel "less than" those around them. The atmosphere of "love the sinner, hate the sin" becomes overwhelming. I know how this feels because my family experienced it personally several times in Wilson. But then, we finally discovered the truly loving and affirming members of First Christian Church.

Some members may be asking – what do we have to do to become official? The DOC-Alliance Q organization has a check list of items we need to complete. Over the years, we've done about 75% of them, now is the time for us to finish the list and make it official. The check list is a combination of proof that we truly are accepting and affirming, that we demonstrate inclusiveness and support local and regional outreach. We will have the full check list at the summer gatherings if you want to review it step by step.

And some members maybe asking – won't that make us the gay church? It will make us one of the few transparent, loving, supportive, open and affirming churches in Wilson. If we had a new daycare center, wouldn't we anticipate an influx of families with small children? If we built a community garden, we would certainly not think twice if a whole bunch of new neighbors with tiny shovels and dirt under their fingernails showed up. Once we officially proclaim ourselves as O&A, we hope to see an increase in attendance and lots of new faces!

I would imagine we have a large percentage of members that are ready to take this next step. But there may also be a few members that are a little uncomfortable or unsure. To those, I say it's ok. As Disciples of Christ, we don't have to agree on everything. We don't have to be 100% confident or even sit on the same side of the aisle. All we have to do is honor Christ, worship together, pray together and love one another.

This next step of becoming officially open and affirming, for me, is both practical and personal. Practical because we need it. Walt Disney used to say the family experience begins in the parking lot. Which is why all Disney parking lots are colorful, have memorable names and the shuttles are friendly and play fun music. In today's world— the experience begins on websites and social media. Rarely does anyone visit a church, a restaurant or vacation spot without first checking it out online. For practical purposes, we need the official open & affirming statement to let visitors know clearly that First Christian Church is the congregation we say we are.

Personally, this church has been my family for 15 years. You have loved me, Deanna, Jessica, and Duncan without question. You've lifted us up, surrounded us in prayer and loved us through everything – and I mean *everything*! Our original plan for Wilson was limited to 5 years. I was here to move up the ladder and then move on. But... then you loved us. We were welcomed and uplifted by Lynn, Joshua, Gary, Jamie and now Scott. From the first time we walked through the doors, to the countless youth activities, CYF and




Opportunities for Ladies of First Christian Church


A Novel Idea

The Heaven & Earth Grocery Store

In 1972, when workers in Pottstown, Pennsylvania, were digging the foundations for a new development, the last thing they expected to find was a skeleton at the bottom of a well. Who the skeleton was and how it got there were two of the long-held se-



crets kept by the residents of Chicken Hill, the dilapidated neighborhood where immigrant Jews and African Americans lived side by side and shared ambitions and sorrows.

Chicken Hill was where Moshe and Chona Ludlow lived when Moshe integrated his theater and where Chona ran the Heaven & Earth Grocery Store. When the state came looking for a deaf boy to institutionalize him, it was Chona and Nate Timblin, the Black janitor at Moshe's theater and the unofficial leader of the Black community on Chicken Hill, who worked together to keep the boy safe.

As these characters' stories overlap and deepen, it becomes clear how much the people who live on the margins of white, Christian America struggle and what they must do to survive. When the truth is finally revealed about what happened on Chicken Hill and the part the town's white establishment played in it, McBride shows us that even in dark times, it is love and community — heaven and earth — that sustain us.
